Rehabilitation of Offenders' Act 1974

The Rehabilitation of Offenders' Act 1974 (Exclusions and Exceptions) (Scotland) Amendment Order 2016 allows people who have been convicted of certain criminal offences to regard their convictions as 'spent' after a period of years. However, due to the nature of the work Quarriers carries out, any role that brings you into one-to-one contact with the vulnerable people we support is therefore exempt from these provisions. Applicants are therefore not entitled to withhold information about convictions that for other purposes are considered as 'spent'. A spent conviction, is a criminal conviction which can under the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act be treated as spent after a specified length of time.

Any information given will be held in the strictest confidence and only used in consideration of your suitability for a volunteering role. Please note that a conviction will not automatically exclude you from volunteering with Quarriers, but will be taken into account when assessing your suitability for the role.

If you are offered a volunteer role with Quarriers and have lived outside the U.K you will be required to apply to your local police authority for a search to be carried out on the Police National Computer File under the category of prosecution/conviction history. You will be asked to share the results with us.
